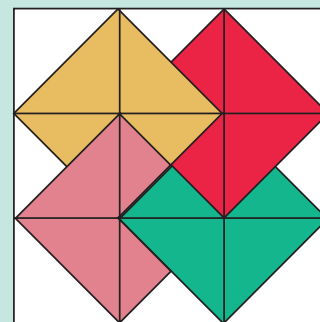
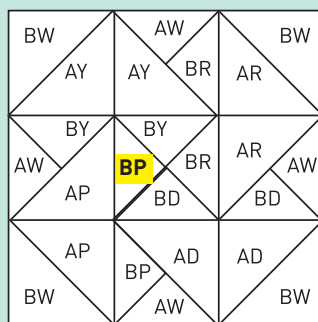

In this block, it appears that the units disappear under each other.

Changes to printed instructions are shown as bold.

From your chosen fabrics, cut the following:

Background Two $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares - cut once diagonally to give 4 triangles (**BW**).

One $5\frac{1}{4}$ " square - cut twice diagonally to give 4 triangles (**AW**).

Yellow fabric One $4\frac{7}{8}$ " square - cut once diagonally to give 2 triangles (AY).

One $5\frac{1}{4}$ " square - cut **twice** diagonally to give **4 triangles (BY)**. **Note only 2 will be used.**

Pink floral One $4\frac{7}{8}$ " square - cut once diagonally to give 2 triangles (AP).

One $5\frac{1}{4}$ " square - cut **twice** diagonally to give **4 triangles (BP)**. **Note only 2 will be used.**

Dark floral One $4\frac{7}{8}$ " square - cut once diagonally to give 2 triangles (AD).

One $5\frac{1}{4}$ " square - cut **twice** diagonally to give **4 triangles (BD)**. **Note only 2 will be used.**

Red fabric One $4\frac{7}{8}$ " square - cut once diagonally to give 2 triangles (AR).

One $5\frac{1}{4}$ " square - cut **twice** diagonally to give **4 triangles (BR)**. **Note only 2 will be used.**

Using the photo as a guide lay out your fabric into the block design.

Block construction

Corner unit A - This is a half square triangle, which we have made before (block 5). Sew a large background triangle (**BW**) to a large coloured triangle along the longest edge. Remember to handle gently as this is a bias edge and will stretch easily.

Press seam toward darker fabric. Make 4 units using a background and large coloured triangle.
